History

The Atlases of Tumor Pathology have a long and distinguished history. They were first conceived at a cancer research meeting held in St. Louis in September 1947, as an attempt to standardize the nomenclature of neoplastic diseases. For many years, the AFIP (Armed Forced Institute of Pathology) and ARP collaborated on publishing the atlases. Since the AFIP closed in 2011, the sole steward and publisher of this valuable resource is the American Registry of Pathology.



The ARP's mission is to advance, educate, and connect the field of pathology by providing the highest quality educational content and expertise.



ARP launched a brand new web platform for our publications in mid-2022.




With this launch, ARP Press has transitioned from print-focused activities to a balanced print and online publishing program, all available at www.arppress.org.
